
Repeat signs:
The ROAD MAP to MUSIC
(keeps you from getting lost)

WATCH FOR THE SIGNS!


This sign means the piece is OVER...STOP Here!



It is called a "Double Bar" or "Double Bar Line"



This forward repeat means that you will come back here later




This backward repeat sign means turn back now...either to the beginning of the piece or the forward repeat sign nearest if there is one

1st ending: do this 1st time only




2nd ending: skip 1st ending. Perform this the 2nd time and go on



Advanced: Some music may have 3rd endings, 4th endings, endings such as "1., 3." and "2. 4." What would you do in these cases?

This is a "sign"



Dal Segno

D. S. al Coda

Go back to the sign, then skip to the Coda



This is the

Coda the tail ending

D. C. al Coda

Da Capo

"the Head"

This means to go back to the beginning of the piece, then skip to the coda sign the second time.



By using the Italian word *Fine*

A piece can end anywhere!

D. C. al Fine means go back to the top, then end at "Fine"

D.S. al Fine means go back to the sign, then end at the "Fine"
